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OLDCASTLE SOUTHERN GROUP AWARDED \$23.6 MILLION SCDOT CONTRACT

ATLANTA—Oldcastle Materials announced today Oldcastle Southern Group, APAC Construction has been awarded a \$23.6 million contract from the South Carolina Department of Transportation. APAC will be widening and reconstructing 4.91 miles of US 278 from SC170 to SC 474 in Beaufort County near the town of Bluffton, S.C., including widening a bridge over the Okatie Creek.

The project will be the first major job to be supplied out of Oldcastle's Camak, Ga., quarry. It is estimated that the project will create 10-15 jobs for the local APAC office based in Savannah, Ga.

"We are very pleased to have been awarded this project, which will provide us a platform to build upon over the next two years," said Oldcastle Southern Group President Rob Duke. "Our team invested a significant amount of time on it – we are proud of their efforts and excited about the opportunities that it will create not only for APAC but also for the community."

APAC anticipates starting the work in mid-November with a scheduled completion date of Nov. 30, 2013. The majority of the project is federally funded with a portion of the funding generated by Beaufort County's special-purpose local-option sales tax (SPLOST) for transportation improvements.
